Meeting of the World Psychiatric Association

The World Psychiatric Association is meeting in Madrid September 5-11, 1966. Positive Disintegration

Kazimierz Dabrowski's paper, "The Theory of Positive Disintegration," which appears in this issue, is taken from his first publication in English, *Positive Disintegration* (Little, Brown and Com-

pany). He has been extensively published in languages other than English.

Dabrowski is a professor in the Polish Academy of Science and the Director of the Institute of Children's Psychiatry and Mental Hygiene in the Academy. Born in 1902, in Lublin, Poland, he received his M.D. at the University of Geneva Medical School in 1929 and a Ph.D. in experimental psychology from the University of Poznan in 1932. From 1935 to 1948, except for the interruption of the German occupation, he was the Director of the Polish State Mental Hygiene Institute and High School for Mental Hygiene in Warsaw, which had been organized with the aid of the Rockefeller Foundation.
